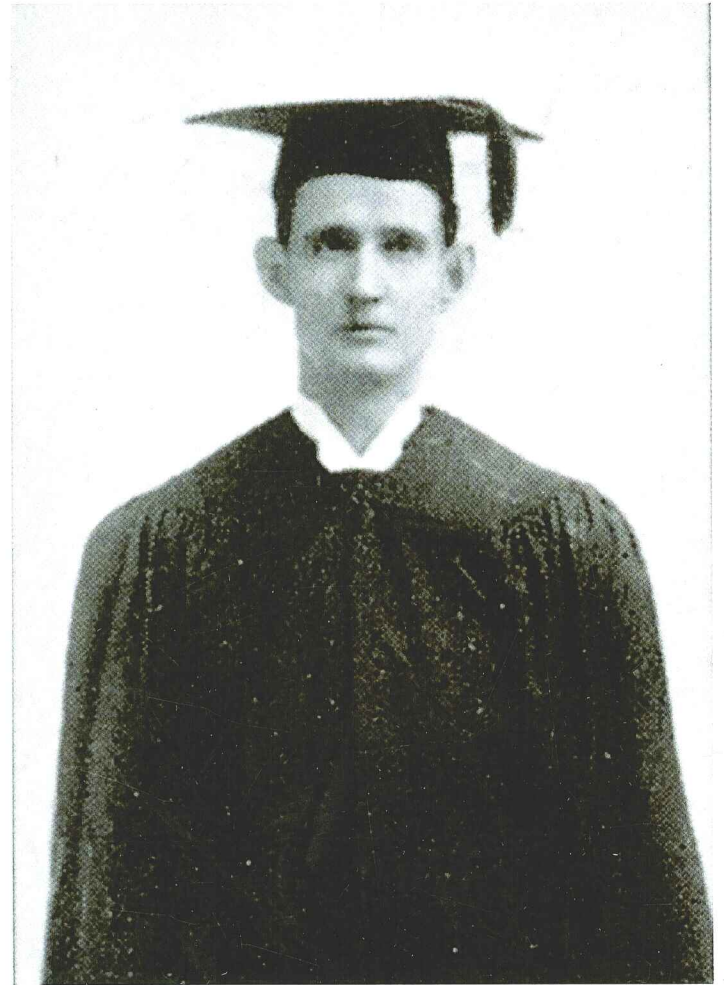


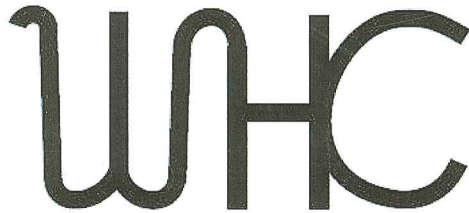
THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA LIBRARIES

Dr. Edward Everett Dale began his working life as a cowboy and rancher in Old Greer County, Oklahoma Territory. He soon turned to education, serving as a teacher and superintendent before graduating from Central State Teachers College, the University of Oklahoma, and Harvard University. He returned to the University of Oklahoma in 1924 to serve as professor of history and chair of the department. He helped found the Western History Collections, originally the Phillips Collection, in 1927. E. E. Dale had a long teaching and publishing career, focusing on Western American and Oklahoma history.
